The James Martin Center for Nonproliferation Studies (CNS) is one of the largest nongovernmental organizations in the world devoted to research and training on nonproliferation issues. The center's mission is to combat the spread of weapons of mass destruction by training the next generation of nonproliferation specialists and disseminating timely information and analysis. CNS seeks Graduate Research Assistants (GRAs) for the fall 2011 semester.

GRAs will have the opportunity to work with CNS experts on various nonproliferation and arms control issues. Work involves editing, updating, and drafting content for CNS publications and sections of the Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI) website (<http://www.nti.org>). GRAs are also required to perform other research and administrative tasks.

Required Qualifications:

- general knowledge of WMD nonproliferation issues;
- excellent writing and analysis skills;
- knowledge of and experience conducting scholarly research;
- highly detail-oriented and capable of meeting deadlines.
