

## Note from the Program Director

With this issue, the Program for Nonproliferation Studies (PNS) begins a new chapter in its organization and development. We have taken a major step towards consolidating different aspects of our research program in merging our two previous publications, Eye on Supply and the Missile Monitor, into The Nonproliferation Review. This move coincides with conceptual developments in the field of nonproliferation studies that seek to link the various areas of proliferation concern with the common analytical approaches used to address them. For the PNS, this move is consistent with our own internal reorganization, which now links the Emerging Nuclear Suppliers Project and the International Missile Proliferation Project with a new focus on Conventional Weapons Proliferation. Together, these three areas of proliferation concern will now be known as the project on Monitoring Proliferation Threats (MPT). The MPT joins the CIS Nonproliferation Project (CISNP) and the International Organizations and Nonproliferation Project (IONP) within a new tripartite PNS organizational structure.

The PNS now possesses an increasingly large and complex set of databases. To help us handle the increased volume of information in our various databases, we are in the process of switching to a more powerful software program known as Metamorph. When fully installed, this new tool will allow us to speed the coding process and thereby bring the information in our databases to readers of The Nonproliferation Review faster than ever before. This change will be of benefit to both our readers and to our database subscribers. Of course, progress does not come without a price. Yet, we are pleased that scholars and policymakers, who have relied on information in the Eye on Supply and the Missile Monitor for a combined cost of \$50, will now be able to enjoy the same information in one place for a single fee of \$40 due to economies of scale. Institutional subscribers will be charged \$75 for the combined information and articles in our new publication.

Our plan for The Nonproliferation Review is for the journal to develop as a clearing house for information and analysis throughout the various subfields of nonproliferation studies. With this in mind, we are interested in publishing articles from both new and established scholars. We are also inaugurating a "Viewpoint" section to encourage the discussion of new, and perhaps controversial, ideas.
